CLUSTER GRANTS REPORT

Sharing People – Annapolis Royal Baptist Pastorate

Elizabeth Legassie thanked the Association for \$750. Cluster grant for the Sharing People. This program meets the second last Thursday of the month. The people of the pastorate are running the program. A meeting last for a couple of hours, free food, fun, fellowship.

People seem to be on board with it. It is going well. When the weather is good 25-30 attend. It usually starts at 5:00 PM. Eat at 5:30 and 6:00 is the program.

Have met people from the community that normally we would not meet. One lady commented how this program got her into church. She now attends church and is getting involved.

The target group for this program is the community. Greatest need is connection to other people. Widows are delighted to get out and socialize. Encouraging people to share and are seeing more of that.

Didn't focus on children, but children who did come were looked after by the people.

The grant has helped to purchase food for the meal.

Impact Youth Group – Operating out of Smith's Cove

Mark Cress thanked the Association for the \$500. Cluster Grant given to the Impact Youth Group.

Mark questioned, Are we getting through? Is this what we are suppose to be doing? Parents responses come through texts, phone, etc. Amazed at the response and support. Youth are facing a lot today. This group is the only church they get. The Impact Youth Group is in its fifth year. Former youth come back and drop in which leaves an impression on the present ones attending.

The group is for youth 12-18.

It started out with the pastors at first, but other people have come forward and are helping out. Six churches are involved and help people lead, supply food, leadership support. The group meets at the Smith's Cove Fire Department and there is no charge for use of the facilities.

Fred Bigelow has been contacted by Canadian Revenue Agency concerning Charities that the Association's Constitution does not contain a non-for profit clause. It is one of the requirements in having charitable status.

MOTION # 3 R. Legassie/M. Cress moved the adoption of the Non-Profit Clause presented be added to the Constitution.

The adding of the Non-Profit Clause will require that the churches of the Association will have to vote in their individual churches to have the clause included in the Constitution.

A discussion concerning Church Insurance was had. There is a meeting at Crandall University on May 30th concerning Church Insurance hosted by Pinnacle. It was felt that someone from the Association should attend this meeting and bring back any info that maybe helpful to our Association Churches. Fred Bigelow mentioned that he had an interest in attending and planned to go.

MOTION #4 R. Legassie/B. McLeod that the clerk, Fred Bigelow be paid meterage to attend the Insurance meeting in Moncton. MOTION CARRIED

The second half of the Council Meeting turned over to Brain Wallace who explained the Emotionally, Healthy, Spirituality Course.

- Discover the Rhythms of the Daily Office and Sabbath
- Grow Into an Emotionally Healthy Adult
- Go the Next Step to Develop a "Rule of Life"

WHY THE EH SPIRITUALITY COURSE?

An estimated 85% of Christians are stuck in their relationship with Christ Only 1% of church leaders say that the church is doing well in discipling new and young Christians

Only 20% of church-goers participate in any type of discipleship activity
Only 1 in 4 Christians study the Bible to find God's will for their lives
Only people deeply changed by Jesus will have a powerful, long-term impact in the world
